

Baltic Biogas Bus Newsletter

One key step in the development of climate neutral public transport throughout the Baltic Sea Region is increased supply of renewable bio-fuels. The More Baltic Biogas Bus project aims to showcase upgrading of more biogas, which will increase biogas availability as vehicle fuel. This was the main topic when all project partners teamed up in the south of Poland June 2nd through 4th.

The main stage Baltic Biogas Bus project helped to push for the introduction of more CNG buses in public transports in the Baltic Sea Region. The buses can run either on upgraded compressed renewable biogas, compressed natural gas or a mixture of the two. However, today there is little or no supply of biogas as vehicle fuel in most countries, resulting in many buses running on natural gas instead.

The More Baltic Biogas Bus project ending later this year, aims to showcase an increased upgrading of biogas in the Baltic Sea Region, as well as conducting a study highlighting the socio-economic and environmental benefits of using biogas as transport fuel, as opposed to generating heat or electricity. This was the main topic on the agenda when all partners teamed up in the cities of Krakow and Niepolomice in southern Poland.

On June 2nd all partners discussed the project progress and outcomes, including investments in eco-driving support systems, biogas-electric hybrid buses and small scale upgrading. On June 3rd a meeting was organized with associated partners from the city of Niepolomice, expressing interest in biogas upgrading of landfill gas as well as running public transport buses on renewable biogas.

On June 4th some of the partners continued on to the city of Tychy where the More BBB project co-hosted a conference on the topic of “methane fuels in municipal transports”. Polish project partner Motor Transport Institute presented the More BBB activities and investments to other Polish stakeholders interested in biomethane production and climate neutral public transports.
